

The Journey Apartments is located at 2471 Lincoln Blvd., Venice, CA 90291, and includes 39 permanent supportive housing units for extremely low-income households experiencing homelessness, including: 28 Studios, nine (9) one-bedroom units, and two (2), two-bedroom units. An additional two-bedroom unit has been set aside for an on-site manager. Nineteen (19) units are reserved for Transitioned Age Youth (TAY) households ages 18-24 experiencing homelessness and 20 units are designated for chronically homeless households.

Department of Mental Health Managed Units: Two (2) TAY Studio units and three (3) one-bedroom TAY units will need to qualify as eligible applicants under No Place Like Home funding definitions. Three (3) one-bedroom chronically homeless Adult units and two (2) two-bedroom chronically homeless family units will also need to qualify as eligible applicants under No Place Like Home funding definitions.

The Journey Apartments expects to accept applications in early March for **households earning at or below 30% of Area Median Income (AMI)** for the County of Los Angeles.

Accessible units are available, as required by the Tax Credit Allocation Committee (TCAC) and other funding agencies, for Mobility/hearing/sight impaired households. Six (6) units will be for residents who are mobility impaired and four (4) units will be for residents who are hearing/vision impaired. Units will include wheelchair accessible doorways, bathtubs, showers, and audible signals. Case Managers/ Service Providers will notify Venice Community Housing (VCH) if an applicant will need an accessible unit. Applicants can apply through Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority's (LAHSA's) <u>Universal Housing Application</u>. Applicants will be able to request a mobility or sensory impaired unit through the UHA. Individuals with a disability have the right to ask for and receive reasonable accommodations and to request auxiliary aids. Individuals may access auxiliary aids (TTY) by calling 711. If as a result of a disability you need changes in the way we communicate with you, please contact us at (310) 399-4100.

There will also be **on-site intensive case management services** (ICMS) for supportive housing, as defined by LA County Department of Health Services ICMS contracts, with Venice Community Housing Corporation as the ICMS provider.

The service provider, Venice Community Housing Corporation, will assist prospective residents through the application process by providing application support for project-based vouchers and eligibility requirements.

Applicants will be referred through the local Coordinated Entry System (CES), Alternative Coordinated Entry System (Alt-CES), the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services, and the Department of Mental Health. Rents will be subsidized by the Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles (HACLA).

Prospective residents can apply for housing using Los Angeles County's Coordinated Entry System (CES) or Alternative CES (Alt-CES). Venice Community Housing (VCH) will work with the local Coordinated Entry System (CES), Alternative coordinated entry system (Alt-CES), and No Place Like Home Match through the Department of Mental Health (NPLH), to identify homeless populations diagnosed with mental illness and transitional-aged youth (TAY) at The Journey Apartments. THE JOURNEY APARTMENTS APPLICATION PROCESS

Interview:

At your scheduled appointment, please come prepared with all requested supporting documents. We will confirm the information supplied on your application, and answer any concerns you may have. This interview normally takes approximately 45 minutes. All persons who will be living in the apartment, irrespective of their age, must participate in this interview. Your leasing associate must verify credit, criminal background check, rental history, and all sources of income and assets. Criminal background checks will align with HACLA requirements. Your patience and cooperation are appreciated.

Apartment Offer:

When all documents have been received, verified and approved, qualified applicants will be invited back to view the apartment that has been selected for them. Remember, you will only receive one offer of an apartment. If you decline that apartment, you will be considered to have withdrawn your application.

Pets:

Pet policy will follow the Pet-Friendly Housing Ordinance Number 2020-0001 of the Los Angeles County Municipal Code, Division 3, Chapter 8.70 (Exhibit A). Additionally, a certified service animal is not considered a "pet" and the resident requiring such animal shall be required to execute a service animal agreement describing responsibilities of the resident.

What if I need changes in the way I communicate with you as a result of a disability?
